We currently have (October 31 2004) 717 indexes, 17,996 printed pages, & 850,142 names indexed. The file size is about 490MB. All these files are on HSGS's CD, but only 93% are on the web site. This is further clarified: The fee is not applicable if a person who just visits the collection or does their own browsing or research using the materials that are located on the open shelves, but does applies when help is needed to access the special collections that are located on the closed shelves. The First Online Genealogy Expo. With the continued widespread use of the Internet in family history research, the Family Link Network is announcing today the opening of registrations for their first online genealogy Expo to be held November 16 - December 16, 2004. The theme is, "Now is the Time, This is the Place, for Genealogy Training to Come to You!!"

The Expo contains 15 online presentations by genealogy professionals ranging from British research to using animated maps. Also included is a presentation called, "Hookers, Crooks and Kooks, Aunt Merle Didn't Run a Boarding House" which shows some of the surprises you may find in your family history closet.

Admission to the Expo amounts to just over \$3.00 per presentation at \$49.95 and includes 24 hour / seven days a week accessibility to the online presentations for the 30-day length of the Expo as well as printable handouts on the material prepared by the instructors. Family Link Expo offers an online Exhibit Hall that the general public can enter and view booths with information on the latest family history products and services. The Family Link Network will also be giving away a prize each day for the 30-day length of Expo I. <u>MI Naturalization Records.</u> Many country naturalization records have been moved to the State Archives, and 22 of these counties have been indexed, including losco County. Check their web site <a href="https://www.michigan.gov/Hal">www.michigan.gov/Hal</a>, then link to Our Agencies, then link to MI History Center, then link to State Archives, then link to Naturalization Indexes.

Note. These records when in Iosco County were controlled by Federal Regulations and were closed to the public for the last several years they were in Iosco County. However when moved to the State Archives for some reason they are open to the Public. When the records were moved to the State Archives (an effort started by HSGS) three advantages came about. 1- They were then open to the public. 2- The Friends of the Archives produced a new and more accurate and complete index, and 3- One of the journals were missing for years in Iosco County, however it was found and sent to the Archives. Progress is GOOD!

<u>Preserve Your Family History.</u> The Allen County Public Library has a long standing service. Individuals who do not have a desire to officially publish their genealogy can send an unbound "master copy" to them. In exchange for the privilege of allowing them to make one photocopy for their collection, they will provide the compiler with one complimentary bound photocopy and will also return the original master. (Saginaw Gen Soc Newsletter, v27n3p375 Nov 2004).

<u>Nationwide Veteran Gravesites.</u> The US Dept of Veterans Affairs has a database of 3.2 million burials of veterans. Wives buried with husbands are included. See <u>www.cem.va.gov</u>. (Saginaw Gen Soc Newsletter, v27n3p376 Nov 2004).


