HSGS Web Site. <www.rootsweb.com/~usgenweb/mi/iosco/3501hsgs.htm> is the address for our HSGS's indexes on the Internet. The search engine for this site, or all of Michigan or any of the other Michigan's counties is www.rootsweb.com/~usgenweb/mi/search.htm. We currently have (May 31 2005) 789 indexes, 21,475 printed pages, & 975,172 names indexed. All these files are on HSGS's CD, but only 93% are on the web site (does not include new indexes within the last month, draft indexes not yet finished, & a some random data corrections). SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT. Thoughts of the 21st Century- will the census have less value? The following information is scary!

- Marriage Records- By 2000, it is estimated that half of the births in the US will be to parents who are not married. How will we fill the data for parents in those births?
- <u>Birth Certificates</u>- Current developments in our society such as artificial insemination and surrogate mothers, have totally changed the role of the vital record for genealogical research.
- <u>Deeds</u>- In the past, researchers were able to trace heredity and migration by checking deeds for farms and homes. Americans are on the move and many live as renters. How will deeds help?
- <u>Church Records</u>- Many churches are keeping their records on computers, but again the high mobility of the population will make the finding of church records difficult.
