We currently have (August 31 2006) 963 indexes, 24,531 printed pages, and 1,089,738 names indexed. All these files are on HSGS's master file & the CD we sell, but only about 94% are on the web site (does not include new indexes within the last month, draft indexes not yet finished, & a some random data corrections).
